NEWS FROM THE ASSESSOR

There are exemptions available to those senior citizens that are or will be 65 during the year that they are filing for the exemption – 2013. The exemptions require that one of the owners meet the age requirement, and that the home is the primary residence.

New and renewal applications for the **ENHANCED STAR EXEMPTION ON THE 2013 ROLL** will be based on the applicant's 2011 income. The **NEW INCOME LIMIT of \$79,050** will be based on the **Adjusted Gross Income of the 2011 Income Tax Return.**

The **Senior Citizen** exemption for County and/or Village tax purposes is available for those 65 and older with an annual income not to exceed \$37,400 for county purpose and \$14,700 for village purposes. This exemption is based on the **Total Gross Income for 2012.**

If you are eligible for the Senior Citizen Exemption you will automatically receive the Enhanced STAR. However, if you are eligible for the Enhanced STAR you may NOT be eligible for the Senior Citizen exemption. They are two separate exemptions.

ALL EXEMPTION APPLICATIONS MUST BE FILED BY MARCH 1, 2013.

If you are in the Income Verification Program you have received a letter to confirm your exemption. If you receive this confirmation by mail you do not have to reapply for the Enhanced STAR exemption. All other applicants have received their renewal applications by mail.

Dear Friends,

Speaking of snow, you folks were VERY cooperative with our first curb to curb snowplowing for the year. We finished in record time and had very few tickets and tows. Your cooperation pays off in savings and in how nice the streets look when we are done. Unfortunately, what was supposed to be a "dusting" a day later, turned out to be almost as much as the original storm. We lucked out with the warm up so I won't complain. We still have at least two more months of this stuff so please remain as cooperative as you have been. Also, please note that if someone has cleared a path for access to their trash barrel on garbage pick-up days, don't be so rude as to park in front of it and prevent the DPW guys from being able to get to it. If you have a recurring problem with someone blocking your path on garbage days, put your barrel in the road. If the Board approves it, we will be sending out instructions for registration and use. In the meantime, please check our website for notifications or call the office.
