## **WHAT'S HAPPENING IN GREEN ISLAND**

November 15, 2015

We lost a good friend and a tremendous asset to our village when Mike died. Mike was instrumental in the life of that building in two ways. First as a member of the Italian Fraternal Society that built the building in the 1960's and then, when the organization decided to close its doors, Mike spearheaded the efforts to have the building be used for the good of our community, arranging for the village to purchase it from the "Italian Club." The rest is history - but it is history that would not be possible if not for Mike. So when Peter DeMento approached me shortly after Mike's passing with the idea to name it after Mike, our Village Board unanimously approved. But it gets better. People wanted to be part of it and have donated the money to cover all costs of new signage, a memorial plaque and two benches for in front of the building. Thank you to the Paganucci family, the Gig A Bite Crew, the Green Island Democratic Association and the Green Island Senior Citizens for their generosity. And thanks to our DPW and GIPA crew for the installation of the benches. Hope to see you on the 28<sup>th</sup>!

Our Festival of Trees is scheduled for Saturday, December 5<sup>th</sup> at the River Park. We will begin decorating our trees at 2:00 p.m. and we will be serving hot chocolate and cookies. Santa will arrive at 5 p.m. for the tree lighting and caroling. Then Santa has promised to stay and visit with all the "good little children" to go over their Christmas lists. We will also be having a tree dedicated to all of our veterans and everyone is welcome to bring an ornament to honor a veteran. We hope to have nice weather, but if it rains, we will reschedule for Sunday. Stay tuned to the website in case of bad weather.

We will be having our "Giving Tree" at the Village Office starting on November 30<sup>th</sup>. This is another example of Green Island folks taking care of each other. If you would like to help, stop in the office and select a tag off the tree. Thank you to all the volunteers that make this possible and thank you to all the gift givers for their generosity. Your reward is in heaven!
